The "Lurich Society" was founded. Ingerman collected donations for the association. In Riga, the statutes were written and finally approved.</p> <p>During this time Jaago worked also as wrestling trainer.</p>

"For a few moments, the circus was in complete unrest, the spectators cheering Schwarz or Jaago. Carlsen Kundruhn, the secretary of the international wrestling association, who was in charge of the match, had a long discussion with the jury and declared Schwarz the winner."

"Kundruhn's words were greeted by a hellish uproar, which so discouraged Schwarz that he made energetic gestures in protest at the gift of victory."

"Jaago, meanwhile, was still watching the commotion with hesitant glances. The audience was protesting in his favour."

"Four large laurel wreaths were brought into the circus for the winners even before there was an official awards ceremony. It all seemed pretty predetermined." [!]

"Schwarz suggested the sharing of the first and second place."

"The jury then declared that the match must go on and that anyone who refused to do so would be declared the loser."

"Schwarz said he would not wrestle against sick people like Jaago, who was too exhausted to continue the match. Schwarz refused to continue and has left the ring." [!]

"Schwarz refused to accept the first place. The first place was now awarded to Jaago." [!]

"Kundruhn then rushed into the manege and announced that Jaan Jaago was the 1923 professional wrestling champion of Europe and Schwarz was awarded the second prize."

"Jaago refused to accept the title and prize money."

Before outbreak of World War Two, Jaago appeared in one of the last professional wrestling tournaments held in Germany. This ended in late August 1939.

Until 1946 Jaago was inactive as professional wrestler.

second half of 1939 > early 1940

At the outbreak of World War II, Jaago remained in Berlin. Until the spring of 1940, he worked as an extra in UFA films ["Nanette" with Jenny Jugo and Hans Schwarz Jr.]. He went to the UFA film studios in Potsdam-Babelsberg for the shooting.

But there were only a few appearances. For months Jaago was unemployed. At the end of 1939 Jaago fell ill with influenza, from which he suffered for months.

Jaago often met with his friend and former sparring partner Karl Veimann ["Hadji Weinura"]. Both wanted to leave for Estonia. They did not receive an exit permit.

March 1940
Jaago is still suffering from a persistent influenza.

Jaago received a letter from his friend Karl Tomberg ["Radko Petrowitsch"] from Tallinn. Tomberg and his wife were able to leave Berlin in February 1940 and travel to Tallinn.

June 1940

Occupation of Estonia by the Soviet Union [beginning in June 1940].

29.06.1940

Jaago's Estonian passport becomes invalid.

August 1940

Closure of the Estonian Embassy in Berlin.

22.10.1940

Jaago gets a Soviet passport and officially becomes a Soviet citizen.

1941

In a letter to his son Rudolf, Jaago writes that he has obtained permission to leave the country and is on his way to Tallinn.

June 1941

At the time of the Wehrmacht invasion of the Soviet Union, Jaago was arrested and deported to a Nazi internment or concentration camp [not Dachau].

1941 > 45

Jaago is placed under house arrest by the Gestapo.

He will not leave his apartment again until May 1945. Only his wife, as a German citizen, is allowed to continue to leave the apartment on Willmannsdamm in Schöneberg.

The apartment building in Schöneberg overcame all bombing raids of Berlin. A large part of the houses in the surrounding area were destroyed.

May 1945
End of World War Two

After the end of the war, Jaago was again in contact with Karl Veimann, who also returned to professional wrestling.

second half of 1945
Jaago works as a translator in Nikolai Krasnikov's car garage in Berlin.

June 1945
The Soviet Military Administration was established. Government of the Soviet sector of Berlin and the Soviet Occupation Zone.

July 1945
Berlin-Schöneberg became a part of US sector.

06.03.1946
Jaago gets a new Soviet passport.

1946

In 1946 Jaan Jaago was hired as wrestling trainer for the [Army] Sports Club of the Soviet Military Administration located in Berlin-Karlshorst.

He had this position until early 1949, but fell ill for more than a year [1948].

He was also the referee of several [soviet] amateur wrestling tournaments in Potsdam, 1946/47 [Spartakiade].

His Supervisor was Eduard Vurgaft, head of the Department of Physical Education and Sports of the Soviet Military Administration.

The Military Administration allowed to held professional wrestling in the Soviet sector [Berlin] and the Soviet Occupation Zone.

Jaago worked mainly as amateur wrestling trainer. The Military Administration allowed him to held professional wrestling in their headquarter in Karlshorst. There was also the base of the [Army] Sports Club and the Gyms and Sports Halls.

While working as trainer, Jaago promoted professional wrestling in Karlshorst with the likes of Assen Georgiev and Vasil Colev [1946/47].

early 1946

Jaago lost his job at Krasnikov's car garage.

He became a member of a commission which reorganized and controlled professional wrestling in the four sectors of Berlin ["Kommission für Berufsringen"].

His official position in this commission was called "representative of foreigners".

Jaago became ill and had to take a longer break.

January 1947
According to reports, Jaago had his last professional wrestling matches in Karlshorst. He won five matches in the tournament and afterwards retired as active professional wrestler.

08.01.1947
Jaago receives an identity card from the US authorities as a resident of the US sector Schöneberg.

March 1947

until the next election held in March 1948. The Commission dissolved later in 1948.

April 1947

"Spartakiade" was held in Potsdam.

Amateur wrestling tournament that lasted 14 days.

Jaago was hired as the main referee.

early 1948 > early 1949

Jaago became ill [heart problems] and had to take a break that lasted longer than 12 months. In 1948 he was completely inactive. He was taken to a hospital for surgery.

June 1948 > May 1949

Berlin Blockade

March 1949

For the last time Jaago worked as trainer in Karlshorst.

June > July 1949

Jaago teamed with Karl Veimann and made a short comeback as promoter of professional wrestling in the french sector [Berlin].

It looks like he was the only promoter who held a wrestling tournament that year in Berlin [all four

sectors]. The last professional wrestling shows in the Soviet sector were held in late 1948. Erich Kowalski, who was the main figure behind the reorganization of professional wrestling in Berlin 45/46, promoted now in Munich and Hamburg. His future business partner Rudolf Zurth returned back in late 1949.

Berlin newspapers:

Jaago teamed with Karl Veimann [known as "Hadji Weinura"] and promoted wrestling in the french sector [Berlin]. Jaago and Veimann [also from Estonia] had intense contact and were closed friends.
