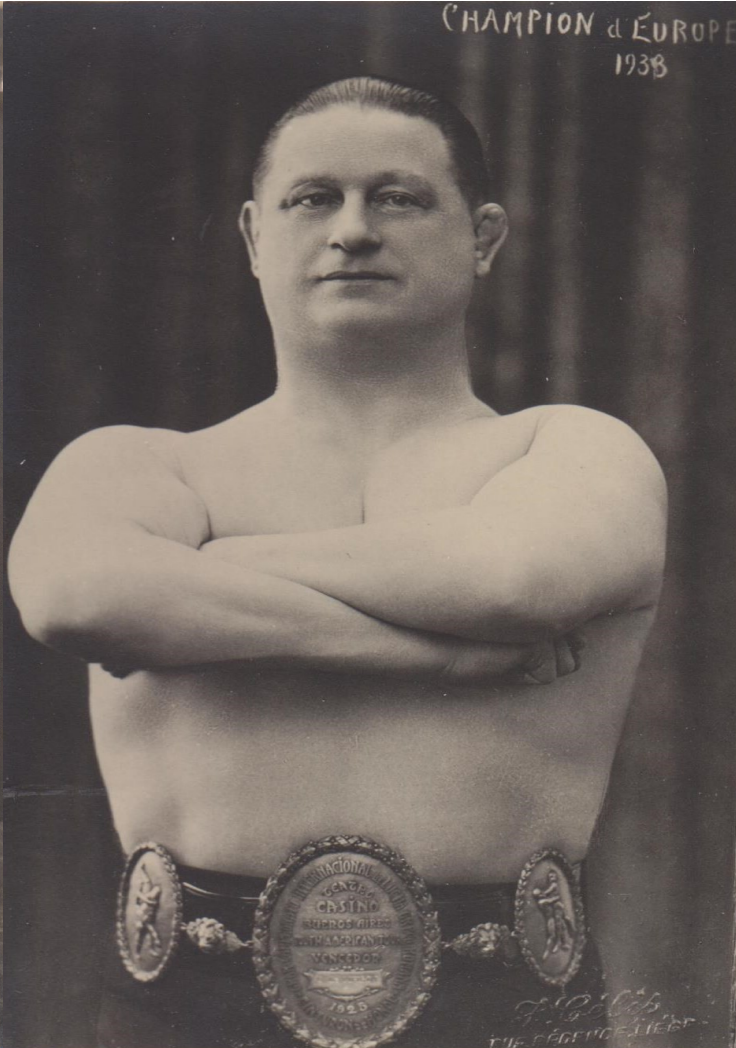

Stanislaus and the promoter claimed that losing a fall didn't lose the match. Stanislaus claimed he could only lose by not winning two falls.“ [Steve Yohe]

- George Kennedy, manager of Constant le Marin and Cazeaux, declared the throwing of Zbyszko ended the match and that it was not necessary for Cazeaux to enter the ring. Jack Herman, manager of Zbyszko, contended that the contract for the match simply called for Zbyszko to throw his opponents in an hour with no stipulation as to what would happen in case the Pole was thrown. The promoters took the same stand and announced that the match should continue. Manager Kennedy refused until Assistant Chief of Police Schuettler, a ringsider, took a hand in the affair and notified Kennedy that his men would have to continue or they would never be permitted to appear again at a Chicago show.

Then Cazeaux entered the ring and took a couple slaps at Zbyszko.

The two falls, with time out for wrangling, had used up 29:35. and it

was up to Constant le Marin to return to the mat to finish out the hour with Zbyszko, according to the “contract.”

Le Marin was in his dressing room and nearly dressed. He refused to return, and the management finally gave him five minutes to change his mind or forfeit the money.
