

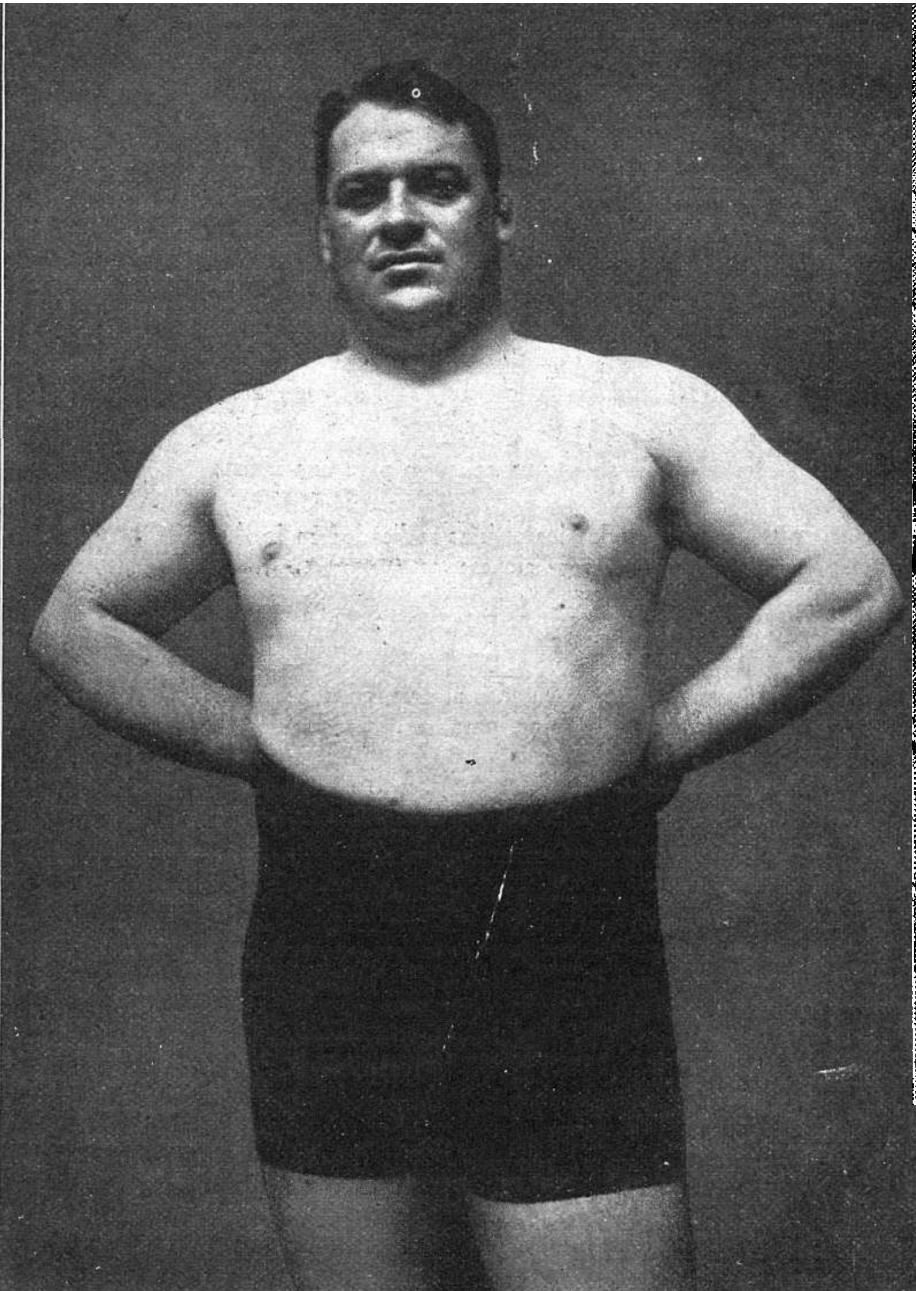


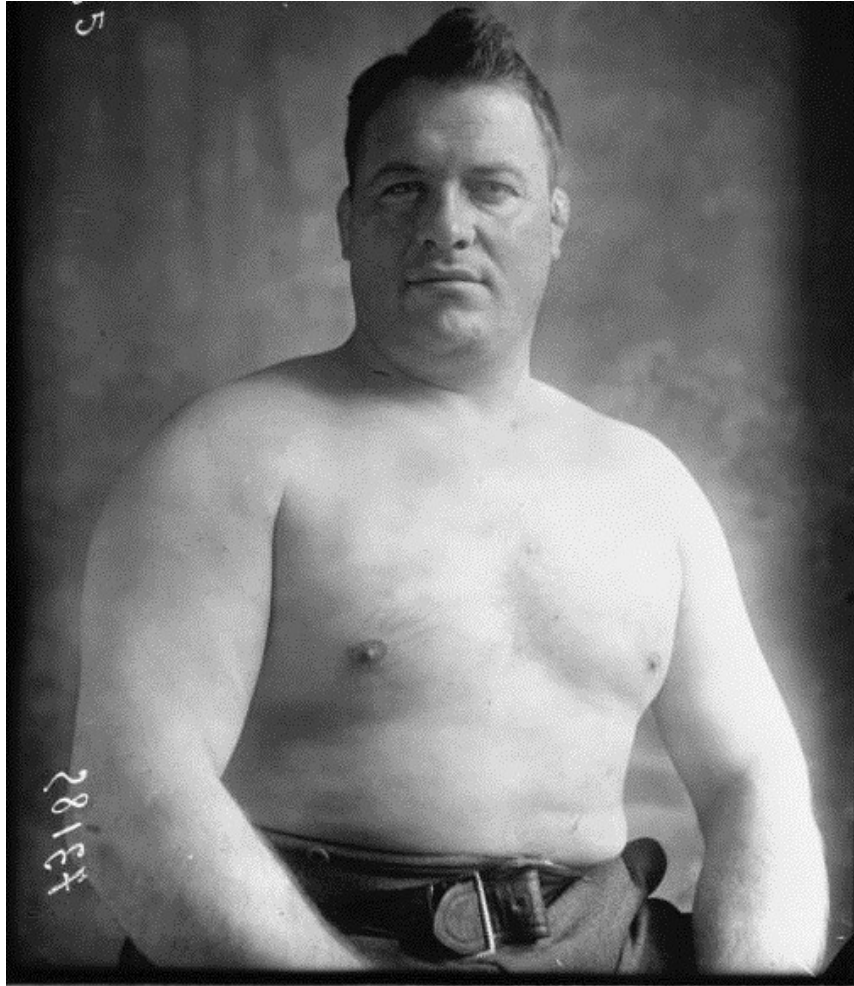

It was December 17, 1912, when he appeared in the club halls on Orueta street, accompanied by a Gipuzkoan athlete from "Harri Jasoketa" (stone lifting), named Manuel de Aguinagalde. Members Cabezuelo and Dieguez did some Greco-Roman demonstration for the club.“
